# **Business Arising**

## Display Trailer

The issue of where to build the noxious weeds trailer was again discussed, with the South Australian suggestion made by WRNWAG debated. **Chris Slinger** confirmed a quote of \$10,628.00 including GST from the Correctional Centre at Junee. This was not including dust seals and a design that would protect electrical equipment. Chris was asked by the group to further investigate the price with the extra features and report back to the group.

 It was moved that the quote be accepted from the Correctional Centre in Junee to construct the trailer pending agreement with WRNWAG.-Rodney Anderson, seconded Neil Hibberson.

The issue of why the group would not buy locally was discussed as well as the benefits such as checking progress at various stages of construction.



#### HLHPA member contributions

The recent restructure of the previous Rural Lands Protection Boards and how this has influenced the amount of member contributions to the Easter and Western Noxious Weeds Advisory Groups since the formation of the Livestock, Health and Pest Authority was discussed. The restructure has removed four paying entities from the region leaving a short fall of funds. **Rob Ferguson** recently voiced the groups concerns via e-mail to **Syd Lisle -** NSW State Weeds Coordinator. **Adam Craig** read the e-mail to the group.

## **Field Days**

- Murrumbidgee Farm Fair at Yanco was held in late April. Fairly quiet on the exhibitors and patronage scale. Discussion may be held as to whether we scale this field day back to being a local one only and concentrate on Griffith's Riverina Field Day.
- Riverina Field Day at Griffith was held in early May. Unfortunately I was not able to attend the field day but from all accounts it was fairly well attended and very successful.

## Mexican Feather Grass ~ the saga continues.....

- Victorian-based seed importer and distributor, Ball Australia, pleaded guilty in May 2009 in the Melbourne Magistrates' Court to four offences relating to the propagation and distribution of MFG. The company was convicted and fined \$12,000 and ordered to pay \$3000 in legal costs. Ball Australia agreed to pay \$20,000 compensation to DPI which will go toward clean-up costs.
- X A recent display hosted by the DPI at the Melbourne International Flower and Garden Show (MIFGS) has resulted in the recovery of more Mexican feather grass plants. 5 reports were made of suspected MFG plants which subsequently resulted in the removal of 11 plants.

New Regional Plans – Silverleaf Nightshade, Sagittaria and Hardhead thistle All three revised regional plans are now available on the web.

- Sending out invoices to all LCAs and LHPAs for their annual contribution to our project -\$1300 (exc GST).

  have a hectic 6 12 months ahead of us so don't put anything off till the last minute.

- The largest component of my time (once I have all the above finalised) will be taken up
  working out what changes NSW DPI have planned for the 2010/11 funding round the
  GP process is about to change significantly and I need to work it all out and then feed all



 the changes back out to the region. Keeping in mind that we pull all our funding applications together in February/March and that we are now in July with September taken up by conference and field days... we have very little time for training etc.

Many changes are going to take place over the next 12 months – some major and some minor – I just hope we can assist with making it an easier transition...... please continue to read all correspondence and Lisa and I will do our best to only send around relevant information.

# **Weeds Officers Reports**

# **Albury**

Control work ongoing on Coolatai Grass. Assisted TAFE students in weed ID and weed removal. Rabbit baiting and cactus removal undertaken. Acquiring a new mapping system for weeds. Checking nurseries, Coolatai inspections at Table Top. Flea Beatle collecting.

# Wagga Wagga

Inspections for African Boxthorn undertaken around the Gumly East Wagga area. Successful in securing a large grant to remove willows through the Caring for Country grant rounds. Participated in CMA funded tree planting for salinity control at Gregadoo planting over 12,000 trees. Working with the Hume LHPA in burning old Spiny Burrgrass infestations.

#### Coolamon/Junee

Checking on Blackberry follow up at Bethungra-good result. Coolatai inspections on road reserves. Releasing of Flea beatles. Road inspections ongoing. Suspected Karoo Thorn found, identified as an Acacia spp. Involved with the Weed Warriors program with Horehound at Marrar. Applied for Crown Land grants and working with the ARTC for Coolatai control.



#### Cootamundra

Undertaking Bridal Creeper control, All Blackberry on public land treated. Presently spraying Coolatai Grass. Inspections ongoing-good compliance. Some small patches of scotch Thistles emerging. Coolatai and Silver Leaf Nightshade control undertaken. Inspections for Scotch Thistles and Horehound. Undertaken African Boxthorn removal with the assistance of Crown Lands. ARTC working in with good cooperation. Suggested Task Force Officers as guest speakers or weed academic people.

#### Corowa

Spot spraying Horehound, African Boxthorn and St. Barnaby's Thistle. Inspections are ongoing. Inspecting private property, commons, State Forests. Undertaking Rabbit inspections.

## Greater Hume

Control of serrated Tussock. Jindera site has emerging seedlings. Inspecting for Alligator weed with 13 plants found so far. Implementing red guide posts to warn of Chilean Needle Grass on RTA roads. Contact in Holbrook is Paul Thompson. Inspections ongoing. Have applied for willow removal project through the CMA.

## Lockhart

Undertaking control works on Bridal Creeper, Horehound and African Boxthorn.

#### Narrandera

Attended the two Field days (Murrumbidgee and Griffith) in May. Commented on Murrumbidgee's poor attendance. Inspections are ongoing. Roadside control of African Boxthorn.

## Tumbarumba

A \$90,000 grant for the removal of willows has been approved. Roadside control of Paterson's Curse and Thistles has also been undertaken recently. Ran a drum muster and Chem collect that was successful. Undertaking private works spray jobs and stem injecting Fruit trees and pines on roadsides.



## Tumut

Inspections and control of Blackberry and Willows undertaken. Thistle control. Releasing Crown weevils appears to be working. Checking Blackberry rust. Suggested Tracy Crawford from snowy Hydro as a guest speaker.

#### Urana

Control of Horehound and African Boxthorn on roadsides. Starting control on shoulders. African Boxthorn control through CMA funding. Inspections are ongoing for Horehound, Wild Radish and African Boxthorn. Noogoora Burr found in creeks. Submission to control Horehound and feral trees through the CMA has been lodged.

## Hume LHPA

John Francis gave an update on control works carried out by the HLHPA. Works have been completed on Horehound and Spiny Burrgrass in conjunction with Wagga Wagga City Council.

#### National Parks and Wildlife

Blackberry rust established on the Goobagandra. Controlling African Lovegrass around the Snowy Mountains HWY. Oxe Eyed Daisy control ongoing. Hawkweed funding sought to detect new infestations. Works on Blowering foreshore commenced. 30,000ha of native vegetation sought to enhance the area and suppress Blackberry.

## **ARTC**

Working with Cootamundra and Junee/ Coolamon on weed control programmes. Slashing around towns, looking at alternatives to chemical control. Mulching and composting etc...

## **General Business**

Weeds Risk Management

**Adam Craig** presented the WRM process to the group. The group worked through Bathurst Burr as an example with a score given that corresponds to a threat matrix. The group was reminded that all of the existing C4 weeds will need to be put through a process to justify wether or not they go back on the list when the sunset clause of five years expires.

This process appeared cumbersome and confusing. Formal training will be provided to weeds officers in the near future.

With the Henty Field Days fast approaching **Lisa Mitsch** suggested that the annual pre Henty meeting needed to be held soon to keep the Field Days running smoothly. A date of August 11, 2009 was announced.
